As promised, I append my favorite Sunday morning breakfast dish:

FINNAN HADDIE A LA DAVIS

Soak two pounds of finnan haddie for two hours in cold water. Then boil slowly for thirty minutes, then separate into flakes.

Make a sauce:

- 1 tablespoons of finely chopped onion
- 2 tablespoons finely chopped green pepper
- 2 tablespoons finely chopped red pepper
- 2 tablespoons melted butter
- $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon paprika
- 4 tablespoons flour, well blended.

Add two cups of milk, mix all well together and cook until thickened, then add the finnan haddie.

Serve with small pieces of toast around the dish.
